### <u>Churches of Snydertown and Pine Grove</u> <u>(Turbotville and McEwensville)</u>

The two towns had 3 churches built about the same year. In Turbotville, a Union Church was built in 1819. It was a log structure just east of the Union Cemetery, It was dedicated as St. Jacobs Union Church, named after Jacob Sechler who donated the ground.

In 1853, it was decided to build a new Union Church for the Lutherans and Reforms to worship in. The Church was almost completed when it burnt down. The old Log Union Church also burnt down the same time.

Rev. S. R. Boyer, who preached at the Union Church from 1845 to 1856, was afraid that another Union Church would meet the same fate. He and a few of his followers broke away, and built Zion Lutheran Church on Paradise Street in 1856.

A number of the Reformed Congregation left and built their own church near the place where the new Union had been. The remaining Lutherans and Reforms rebuilt what was left of the burned structure and dedicated it on April 30, 1857, as St. James Union Church.

The first Baptists built a church on Broadway Street in 1868.

In McEwensville, a Union Church was built in 1810. It was called the "Church in the Pines." It was located at the south end of town where all the roads come together.

The next congregation was the Reformed. In 1842 they united with the Lutherans and built a church on Church Street. In 1874 the Reforms built their own church on the corner of Main Street and Potash Road – it is now the United Church of Christ.

The Warrior Run Presbyterian congregation had a disagreement over burial grounds and who was going to be minister when Rev. John Bryson retired. About half of the congregation went to McEwensville and built the Bethal Church on Church Street in 1842. The Rev. J. P. Hudson (Rev. Bryson's Son-In-Law) was now their minister. It was located across Church Street from the Montgomery House Library.

The spring of 1842, the Baptists built a brick church on Main Street. It is now an empty lot about 34 down Main Street heading south on the east side.

The Methodist congregation built a frame building on the east side of Main Street in 1867. The church was later acquired by the McEwensville Borough and is now the Community Hall.

So, the small town of McEwensville had a total of six churches over the years, and Turbotville had five.


