Grist Mills on the Warrior Run Creek

There were four mills on the WR Creek. Jacob Freeland built a mill in 1773-1774 with irons he brought with him from New Jersey. Hower's and McFarland's were later in about the same area. Next mill downstream was Wilson's built around 1795 at the north end of McEwensville. This would later be owned by Dave Gold, Mr Bennett, Mr. Fetzer and H.L. Shuman. Truckenmillers Mill located between McEwensville and Pioneer would later become Warrior Milling Co. In Pioneer you had Vincent's Mill and later it would be Keiser's Mill.

There were two dams, may have been more, on the WR Creek. One was called Dreisbach Dam located across the railroad tracks about where they do butchering on Heritage Days. Parts of the dam can still be seen. The dam ran water to Hower's Mill by a mill race. Hower's Mill was located in front of Mr. & Mrs.Ted Menges brick house. Henry Wesner, a mill wright by trade, came here from Berks County to help with the building of Hower's Mill in the 1840's. While doing this, he lived in the home of Stephen Amos Glazes at Warrior Run (now Henry Martins on Glaze Road) where he met Elizabeth Hill a niece of Mrs. Glaze. They were married and began housekeeping in a log cabin owned by Jacob Stitzel north of McEwensville. Jacob Stitzel and Dave Gold had an agreement made March 18, 1849, that specified the maximum height at which the water level should be maintained. The renumeration was twenty-five cents to be paid yearly on April 1st of each year. This continued for eight years.

The Hower Mill would be purchased by John McFarland, one best known early residents of this section, was a native of the north part of Ireland and was born in 1817. He came to this country when about sixteen years of age, and soon developed the sterling, industrious and ambitious qualities of his race. After working for a number of years on a farm, near what is now the city of Reading, he became a contractor on the Little Schuylkill Railroad, and assisted in laying the first strap-iron rails on that road. Later he was a contractor on the Catawissa Branch of the P.& R.R's, building a portion of the road and of the Big Mountain tunnel, near East Mahanoy Junction.

After completing this work, Mr. McFarland came to this section, purchasing two farms and the grist mill near Warrior Run Church. These properties were greatly improved with new buildings and the mill placed in first-class condition.

In 1868, Mr. McFarland built the Watsontown Flouring Mill, operating it and dealing in grain for over twenty years, during which he refitted the mill with a complete equipment of full roller process machinery, making it one of the best in this part of the state. In 1890 he sold the mill to Follmer, Fowler & Co. and retired from active business. This mill on Eighth Street would later be owned by the Hefty Family.

Mr. McFarland built the handsome home, corner Main and Eighth streets, and in many other ways showed his progressive spirit. He died in 1897, loved and respected by all who knew him. The two farms are now owned by Leon W. Hagenbuch and Ted Menges. John

(570) 538-1756 OR info@freelandfarm.org McFarland would sell the farms to Dr. Maul from Turbotville. The mill had a steam engine installed but never turned a good profit. It was torn down and rebuilt in Turbotville by the railroad by Harry Dye. He would run the mill till he died and his wife would run it for two more years. Around 1941, Joe Clark from Shamokin would take ownership. His son Ned, would continue the feed mill until it was torn down. The Clark family has an Ag Store in town at the present time. Dr. Maul was related to Ruth (Kramm) Moser and her sister Jane (Kramm) Schuman. Ruth was born on the farm that I live on. My grandfather moved on this farm in 1936 and bought it in 1938 after Dr. Maul went bankrupt.

Warrior Run Church Sign

In February 2015, the WRFFHS received an endorsement letter from Senator John R. Gordner, and PA State Representative Lynda Schlegel Culver to assume the operation of the historic Warrior Run Church. The Society is committed to maintaining the Warrior Run Church, grounds and historic cemetery as an educational resource for the public. The process of signing over the church from the state and the county transferring the deed was official in the spring of 2018.

As a requirement, the state signs around the church had to be removed. The board approved the purchase of a new sign last fall. Prices were obtained from different area sign shops, but the job was given to The Sign Shop from South Williamsport. The hand carved, double-sided sign is made from heavy foam board (HDU), and at the bottom are hooks to hang smaller signs for the Strawberry Festival, Heritage Days, and the Candlelight Service. The cost was \$4,360, which included installation. It was installed during a snow squall on April 16, 2020, near the corner of Susquehanna Trail and Eighth Street. If you would like to help the Society offset the cost of the sign, please write checks to the WRFFHS and mail to Cathy Metzger, 2575 Turbot Avenue, Watsontown PA 17777. The burgundy color with gold leafed lettering sign is a wonderful addition to the church grounds!
