

#### Message from the President

Dear Warrior Run-Fort Freeland Society Members, and Friends,

We had a very festive December with a wonderful candlelight service on December 10. We are not up to pre-pandemic attendance, but all enjoyed the music and ushering in the holiday season. The following Saturday, the Shikelimo chapter of the Daughter's of the American Revolution had over 50 people helping at Wreaths Across America ceremony, with all military graves having a wreath placed in the historic Warrior Run cemetery. The weather cooperated, and we did not have rain this year!

Behind the scenes in December, we had a few contractors come to give quotes on both the cemetery wall restoration, and for painting in the windows, and interior areas of the Warrior Run Church. Prior to the Society taking ownership in 2018, the Pennsylvania Historic Museum Commission (PHMC) had some work done to the wall, but it was patching more than restoration. The historic wall has not had major work done since the 1950's after a storm came through and damaged the church and grounds (some of you might remember it). At that point in time, the PHMC paid to have the work done. The wall needs to have work started soon before it goes into disrepair. The windows, interior walls, doors, and pews need painting too. We have applied for one grant, and are in the process of working on a second one.

The board is busy preparing for our annual events. As I stated in the previous newsletter, we need volunteers that are willing to co-chair the Heritage Days committee. We have many dedicated people who faithfully help every year that know their areas, but in order to make it all work, we need to have cohesiveness for the whole event. If you feel you could help be a co-chair, please reach out any of our board members or to ask questions.

In January, a few board members met with the new superintendent, Thor Edmiston, and Michael Freeborn, the principle of the elementary school about reestablishing relationships with the WRSD and the Society. We are very excited to be working with them, and how the Society can be part of hands-on teaching experiences so students gain better understanding of the local history and what is literally in their backyard.

We are looking forward to seeing you at our upcoming April membership dinner and Strawberry Festival in June.

## Frank Emerson Delong By Leon Hagenbuch

Frank Emerson Delong was born in Danville in 1864, and attended public schools and the Kelso Academy. When he was a young man he entered the employ of a mining and engineering company in New York City where he lived for five years. In 1889, he began to devote his entire time to inventions, working on various articles among them being a folding cardboard box and an electric stenograph.

Mr. DeLong's best invention was the Delong Hook and Eye, made famous because of the clever commercial "See That Hump." The hump being the special feature of the Delong patent. Safety pins, hair pins and other similar items were added to the Delong line and the Delong Hook and Eye company's products were sold on a worldwide basis.

In time Mr. Delong became one of the largest real estate owners in center city Philadelphia. He also purchased several farms in the Washingtonville area. One partial residence was "Delong's Mansion" near the town. This is where he would spend his vacations and upon retirement, his permanent home.

In 1832, a Presbyterian church was built in Washingtonville but because of dwindling congregation the church was sold to Mr. Delong in 1925. He converted it to a Community Hall and Library in honor of his mother who went to this church for many years.

Beside the Jane E Delong Hall, he had the Delong Memorial School built in 1931, for the Washingtonville-Derry Township School Districts.

Frank E. Delong died in Palm Beach Florida on February 6, 1939.

On one of his farms, he had a track for horse races on major holidays. The second food stand at Heritage Days was a concession stand at the race track.

## Spring Dinner April 25, 2023 Turbotville Community Hall at 6:00 P.M.


